
New Shore based Start/Finish Line From April 2024

The Gist

The start line is between the red and white pole in front of the race hut and a blue flagged buoy. There will be an orange flagged buoy laid at the shore end of the line. You must sail between the blue and orange flagged buoys. The orange flagged buoy may not be on the line.



Sailing Instructions affected: 10.2, 12.2 and 13.1

The new Instructions:

- 10.2 The Course will be designated by numbers and/or letters identifying the marks in the order they are to be passed. A red background to a number or letter means: Pass this mark to port. A green background means: Pass this mark to starboard. The letter G on a white background means: Gate. For a shore-based start, the gate is designated as between the red and white pole and the buoy with a blue flag. An orange flagged buoy will be laid. Boats approaching the gate shall pass between this mark and a buoy with a blue flag. For a committee boat start, the gate is between the committee boat and a buoy with a blue flag.
- 12.2 A shore-based start line. An orange flag will be flown from the Race Office Flagstaff which means: The starting line is between the red and white pole in front of the Race Office and a buoy with a blue flag. An orange flagged buoy will be laid. Boats approaching the line shall pass between this mark and the buoy with a blue flag.
- 13.1 The shore-based finish line is between the red and white pole in front of the race office and a buoy with a blue flag. An orange flagged buoy will be laid. Boats approaching the line shall pass between this mark and the buoy with a blue flag.
